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CASE BACKGROUND

- Madison Area Office received report of amputation
- Food manufacturing facility
- Indicated that employee was clearing food material from mixer towards end of shift
- Inspection initiated under National Emphasis Program on Amputations in Manufacturing Industries.
- 2022: Local Emphasis Program for Food Manufacturing Industry



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CASE BACKGROUND CONT.

- $^{\circ}$ Employees added oil and salt to mixture at end of production run
- Then run mixer to loosen materials
- S.O.P. indicated to "push" remaining mixture out
- Employee partially opened interlocked door on top
 - Pushed remaining mixture out with left hand
 - Could reach into bottom of mixer with door partially opened
 - Easily bypassed guard
- Fingertip of left thumb was amputated

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CONCERNS

- Written lockout/tagout procedure for mixer machine
- Employee had received training on application of lockout/tagout
- Interlock (unknown classification) had been replaced/altered following injury
- Guard was easily bypassed so that mixer would continue operating
- $^{\circ}$ Could fit hand/forearm through door opening with mixer operating
- Machine guarding or lockout?

ABATEMENT SOLUTIONS

- $^{\circ}$ Lockout/tagout when reaching inside mixer $\underline{\text{OR}}$
- $^{\circ}$ Installation of new guarding & interlock on door
- Provides alternative effective protection = task can be considered minor servicing activity under 1910.147(a)(2)(ii)(B)
